

This riparian (creek-edge) forest will soon be approved for development. It is 30 feet from Longfellow Creek in an Environmentally Critical Area.

Meanwhile, just a few feet away, taxpayers are paying millions of dollars in order to restore salmon habitat.

Why bulldoze an existing forest just to replant it a few feet away?

(FYI: An AIA architect has confirmed the same amount of housing can be built without removing this forest.) Longfellow Creek Forest protects Seattle from climate change:

- 53 western red cedars and many other native trees
- Forest's roots filter stormwater to Longfellow Creek
- Creek is one of the only two remaining salmon-bearing creeks in SEA
